Who we are



Primary Healthcare (Sanjeevani)

The health intervention is aimed to provide primary healthcare services to the people living in rural and remote areas of the country. People live in inaccessible locations; generally constrained by distance, challenging public transportation system, rough topographic and climatic conditions, cost incurred for visiting health clinics and opportunistic cost of labor lose. The problems in connection with weather intensifies during the rainy seasons in the form of landslides, mass wasting and roadblocks. This further limit the access to health care services. Due to these issues Bhavishya Bharat continued to provide quality health care services through Mobile Medical Units (MMU) and Clinical Unit at the doorsteps of 98 villages located in isolated areas of Sikkim with the support of **The Hans Foundation** (THF), State Bank of India Foundation (SBIF) and Teesta Urja Limited (TUL). Total **2,18,715** people have been covered through various activities in this Health Initiative called Sanjeevani towards Sustainable Development Goal 3: Good Health and Wellbeing.

Mobile Wellness Unit (MWU's)

The MMUs are operated by qualified medical team; they carry diagnostic equipment as well to provide pathological services. The units are designed to carry out all the fundamental health services, such as diagnosis and treatment of common illness and provision of quality medicines. The Mobile Wellness Unit (MWU) visits a village twice in a month and provide health services through conducting Mobile Outpatients Department (MOPD). The people used regularly utilize those MMUs as their first point of contact to get cured.






Health Clinic

The clinic is equipped with all the facilities as in MMUs but there are two observation beds for primary emergency services as well. The Health Management Information System (HMIS) of whole operation of project Sanjeevani is maintained from this clinic as well.





Total Patient Treated Clinic OPD: 1851

Pathological Test

Bhavishya Bharat continued to provide free pathological services for those vulnerable people in the project area, so they can save the money and time that had to be spent for test like Blood Sugar Level, Blood Grouping and others.







Awareness Session

Through all MOPDs and planned awareness camps, Bhavishya Bharat conducted various awareness building campaigning on various in-trending topics like 'Smoking and drinking alcohol', 'Menstrual Hygiene', 'Optimum pregnancy care', 'Child health' and some specific diseases. Programme team used wall-paintings, videos and various IEC materials for awareness building withing community people. Many people live in the remote areas and they do not have access to quality information due to various constrains. Understanding healthy practices and adapting the same is important to secure a healthy life. The health awareness sessions were organised with different stakeholders like students, youth, pregnant women and lactating mothers, adolescents & women, men and elderly. Approximately 5000 pieces of IEC materials have been distributed among people for house-hold level on Handwashing technique, Sanitation, Personal & Domestic hygiene, Environment conservation and others.



Specialized Health Camps

Bhavishya Bharat continued conducting Specialized Medical camps in the project villages after considering the medical needs of the population. Qualified and experienced medical practitioners were appointed based on the needs of the project area to conduct the specialized camps. These activities were organized under the supervision of local self-government and medical department. The medical camps offered different pathological tests and treatments for different ailments. Treatments were given for the following ailments in the reporting period like Cardiovascular, Respiratory, Gastroenterological, Cerebrovascular, Locomotor, Ear, Nose and Throat (ENT), Obstetric and Gynecological and Other Infectious ailments. Specialist physicians were invited to hold sessions on Dental Camp, Dermatology Camp, ENT Camp, Eye Camp, Gynecology Camp, General Camp and Pediatric camp.

Education (Kishlay)

Bhavishya Bharat works on primary education since 2008 with the support of **Teesta Urja Limited**. Hostel was established for students, those who cannot commute to schools from remote villages. Sponsorship program for 78 vulnerable rural students in a reputed privet schools was continued. Regular supplementary classes for high schools' students were conducted in selected project villages. Career counselling sessions, e-learning sessions, interschools competitions etc. were held regularly. Conducted e- Learning Centers, Tuition Centers, Awareness Development Sessions to build a stronger generation for future India.

Knowledge Centre

Eight Knowledge centers were functional in 8 project villages in Sikkim. It is a space constructed locally with the aim to reduce the knowledge gap and improving the awareness level of rural communities. In the knowledge center the children from the project villages get tuition from the teachers appointed by the organisation for five days in a week. Regular tests are also conducted to assess the learning outcome of the children. The center has a collection of books, drawing & coloring materials, articles, magazines, and technical documents that provide a range of various information to the community. It is also a platform where people can come to learn and to share information. Various Indoor and outdoor games facilities are also available there. The habit of reading newspapers and referring to the dictionary has been improving gradually among the villagers.





Residential Scholarship Programme

70 children from the project villages have been supported under the sponsorship program. Among the sponsored children 26 are studying at Singhik Secondary School (SSS) and 44 are studying at the North Sikkim Academy (NSA), Mangan. Regular activities such as monitoring progress of students at SSS and NSA, organizing quarterly health check-ups like- eye, dental and general at hostels for the sponsored students and regular visits to supervise the cleanliness of hostels, food quality and student's health and hygiene were also carried out in the reporting period.

e-Learning Centre

e-Learning Centre is a space construed in the project villages, exclusively dedicated for children of five to twelve years old. The e-learning portal hosts lessons for standard I to X in various subjects including Mathematics, English, Science, Social Science, Physics, Biology and Chemistry. It also has 'Game' sections that have rhymes, children's stories and fairy tales, multiplication tables and moral stories in the form of colorfully animated pictures and words. Children can walk into the e-Learning center whenever they want to study.









Shiksha Yatan Tuition Center

Many of students need special care of study and parents try to help them through tuition classes, But it is unfortunate that many families cannot afford tuition fees for their children. Shiksha Yatan Tuition Center has been initiated to support those children especially, in the subjects of Science, Mathematics and English. The primary emphasis is to enable children from the 5th to 10th grades to obtain a quality education after school hours. The students can also access subject reference books and guidebooks in the Tuition Center. Qualified teachers have been appointed For clarification of doubts, subject teachers were also made available. To make the learning more interesting, the students were involved with various Competitions, Tournaments and various activities. The children were also allowed to play games in presence of the teacher.

Extra Curriculum Activities

Education, only through books and bounded inside only lesson with words and numbers may not enough for growing children. Therefore, Bhavishya Bharat provides numbers of other curriculum activities like, Badminton Tournament, Ludo Competition, Chess Competition, Chess Tournament, Quiz Competition, Grandma's/Grandpa's storytelling, drawing competition, dance, music, etc. Children enjoy these activities that help them to be more active.

















Livelihood (Jeevika)

North Sikkim is a famous place for tourism but difficult place to access due to its geographical position. People there have provision to cultivate crops but that used mostly for their own consumption. Due to this reason, making money for the households became harder through business. Tourists come into this place and find local products for high rates, because of the expectation of more profit. The Livelihood programmes of Bhavishya Bharat with collaboration of TULSSP and NABARD have been initiated to promote various livelihood options that can help to grow their earnings. This intervention has affected the whole system in a positive way. The beneficiaries are now able to make profits out of their sales and the local products became cheaper than before to the tourists.

SHG Formation

Bhavishya Bharat have been facilitated the formation of women SHGs and providing continuous support for the group activities. SHGs were promoted by the organization consists of 5 to 15 women who were either housewives, farmers, or daily wage earner. The SHG members make small regular savings that contributes towards the financial corpus of the group. Later this money is used for lending within the group. Funds may lend back to the members or to others in the village for any purpose. The interest generated from the lending was added to the corpus-fund of the group. Every month the members gather in an agreed place and discuss the issues mentioned in the agenda of the meeting, then carry out the thrift related activities. Savings of each month is collected and recorded in the cash registers.





Training

To build capacities of the formed SHGs, there were trainings on various trades like Mushroom Production, Cushion Making and Candle Making. Training materials were provided to the participants. All the training modules were developed in Nepali and English so they can refresh their knowledge by their own. To give handholding supports they were trained with market linkages and financial literacy. To showcase their products a Rural Mart was established where people could buy their products with reasonable market price. A refresher training was provided to those beneficiaries to make them more confident on their business.

Cattle Treatment Camps

A large number of populations depend on domestic animals like cow, buffalo, goats, pigs etc. Bhavishya Bharat organized veterinary treatment camps, where the owners of the animals received medicines, vaccinations, and doctor's consultations. That initiative helped them to save the cost of treatment of their cattle.



Seed & Sampling Distribution

To support the farmers further, the organization provided seed for potato plantation and high-quality sampling of their famous large-cardamom for free of cost or at subsidized cost.





Social Development (Sahyog)

Bhavishya Bharat believes in integrated development model that contains various components of sustainable initiatives. Social development is regarding up the well-being of each individual in society so that they will reach their full potential. The success of society is connected to the well-being of every and each subject. Their families also will act and therefore the whole of society will be benefited.

Sahyog

To help the elderly people who might be in dire need of help for their survival, Bhavishya Bharat initiated 'Sahyog'; a unique initiative to stand beside those senior citizens. It is a Support an Aged programme that envisages supporting the disadvantaged elderly people to live with respect and dignity. They receive monthly supply of ration and other essential with cash support of Rs. 200 every month.



Swachh Bharat Abhiyaan

Bhavishya Bharat have promoted the Government of India's flagship programme; Swachh Bharat Abhiyaan, a mission for a clean India, with the active participation of community. To outspread the campaign and to ensure proper hygiene and cleanliness in the project villages, Bhavishya Bharat in support with Panchayat and Community periodically conducting massive cleanliness drive. As a part of this programme, a series of activities were conducted in eight project villages covering 555 people. All these activities were conducted with the support of the local self-government.





Disaster Risk Reduction (Sahayata)

The project area is considered as disaster prone area, Land-sliding is a common incident there. In the reporting year there were 2 major Flash Floods have taken places that brought various losses along with. Many people had lost their houses, livelihood, land and domestic animals. Bhavishya Bharat is committed to stand beside them for always in such situation. The organization responded in all these incidents to provide psychological, medical and relief supports. Bhavishya Bharat also believe in building a trained group of people in the community so they can help each other to reduce the risk of any disaster. The organization conducted training camps on Fire and Safety Mock Drill to make the youth capable to take responsibility in disaster situation.





Ramom Village Flash Flood Response

On 10 June 2019, the people of Ramom village faced a devastated flash flood due to heavy rains in North Sikkim. Steel footbridge over Ramom Khola along with a portion of newly constructed road had been swept away. People had lost their vehicle, cardamom field, construction materials, house, etc. Bhavishya Bharat took an initiative of a quick response to the affected people in the area with support of Teesta Urja Limited. The response team visited the place with medical personnel to provide the necessary support. Relief kits were also distributed to all victims, those who were in need. The relief kit bag contained uncooked foods like rice, potatoes, vegetables, spices etc. along with candles other essential items as possible.



Tsong Village Landslide and Flood Response


