


# **Primary Health Care**

Making Primary Healthcare Available, Accessible, and Affordable for Hard-to-Reach People

### Sanjeevani

Despite the diligent endeavors undertaken by the Central and State governments, who have established an extensive network of healthcare facilities throughout the nation, a significant segment of the population, especially those residing in hard-to-reach areas, remains either unattended or insufficiently served. Bhavishya Bharat, through its Sanjeevani program, endeavors to offer primary healthcare services to individuals dwelling in these challenging regions where public health provisions are grossly inadequate.



Presently, Bhavishya Bharat extends its services in Telangana and Sikkim, employing specialized Mobile Medical Units that receive support from the SBI Foundation and The Hans Foundation. The Sanjeevani model of healthcare delivery entails providing primary medical care at the village level via well-equipped mobile medical units. Each unit comprises a qualified doctor, a pharmacist, a laboratory technician, and a driver cum healthcare assistant. The medical team conducts two visits per month to each village of the project area, offering health check-ups, conducting pathological tests, and dispensing medications free of cost. To combat and diminish the burden of diseases, health awareness sessions focusing on critical public health issues are conducted.







Through this initiative, Bhavishya Bharat works closely with local healthcare departments, such as primary health centers, community health centers, and district hospitals. The collaboration involves various aspects, including coordination, resource sharing, and capacity building. Furthermore, Bhavishya Bharat actively participates in awareness campaigns and health education programs in collaboration with local healthcare departments. These initiatives focus on promoting preventive healthcare practices, hygiene, immunization, and disease management. By working together, they aim to create awareness and empower the community to take charge of their own health.

# KEY FEATURE

People get access to Primary Healthcare services, Medicine, and Pathological Services at their doorsteps by conducting mobile OPD.

People receive diagnostic & treatment for specific diseases like Eye Care, Reproductive Tract Infection, ENT, and Orthopedic problems through Specialized Health Camps.

Continuous awareness programs improve adherence to health & hygiene practices and health-seeking behavior.

The project reduces the out-of-pocket expenditure by negating the travel cost, medicine, tests expenditures & loss of labor.

Through convergence with local government and health authorities, overall health services have been improved in project areas.













### Case Study

Miss Lalitha, a 15-year-old teenage girl residing in Kalugotla Village, Jogulamba Gadwal District, finds herself in a challenging situation. Living with her parents, she depends on her father, who toils as a daily agriculture laborer, to support their family. However, for the past five years, she has been afflicted by a persistent ailment known as Aphthous Ulcer. This condition has caused her constant discomfort and swelling of an ulcer on her lip. Despite her efforts to seek relief through medication, her condition showed no signs of improvement. Fortunately, a glimmer of hope arrived with the arrival of the Sanjeevani medical team in her village. This dedicated group promptly initiated the Mobile Outreach Primary Healthcare Program (MOPD), offering essential medical services to those in need. The medical officer from the team attentively exam-



ined Ms. Lalitha and recommended a biopsy. This procedure involves extracting a small portion of the affected tissue from the ulcer site. The purpose of the biopsy is to evaluate whether the ulcer is benign (non-cancerous) or malignant (potentially cancerous).

Consequently, the medical officer referred her to the reputable Gadwal General Hospital, ensuring she received the specialized care required. Simultaneously, the medical team provided Ms. Lalitha with vitamin and zinc supplements to aid in the healing process. Following the doctor's advice, she diligently adhered to her medication regimen, leading to a gradual subsiding of her pain. This positive development brought immense relief not only to Ms. Lalitha but also to her parents. They extend their heartful gratitude to Bhavishya Bharat and SBI Foundation for their unwavering support, compassionate treatment, and invaluable referral guidance throughout their daughter's medical journey.

In this story, we witness the power of medical intervention and community support in transforming the life of a young girl burdened by an enduring ailment. Through the combined efforts of dedicated medical professionals and organizations Bhavishya Bharat and SBI Foundation, hope and healing become attainable realities for those in need.

### **EDUCATION**

Transforming the Learning Environment in Government Schools to Promote Digital Literacy and Quality Education

### **Kishlay - Digital Learning Programme**

The educational initiative of Kishlay - Digital Learning program started by Bhavishya Bharat is intended to empower students of underprivileged communities by making computer education available and accessible. Through Kishlay intervention, currently we are implementing this program in 10 government schools located in Hyderabad, to provide digital literacy and e-learning opportunities to underprivileged students in these schools from classes 5 to 9 within these educational institutions. Simultaneously, teachers have also undergone training via the Kishlay - Digital Learning Programme for extending their support further for the self-sustainability of this initiative after the phaseout of the program. Through this initiative, several activities and events are organized to enhance student motivation, ultimately contributing to the comprehensive development of the students. Following the implementation of this intervention, a partial increase in student enrollment and retention was observed within these schools. Through these computer systems, students have access to specially tailored e-learning modules that facilitate effective learning. The classrooms have been thoughtfully adorned to foster an environment conducive to digital education, captivating the students' attention.

# An Integrated Rural Development Model in Sikkim

### **Alkem Foundation Supported Activities**

### **Alkem Aatma Nirbhar Gram Programme**

The Aatma Nirbhar Gram Programme Project was initiated with the aim of training 150 members of Self-Help Groups (SHGs) in oyster mushroom cultivation and noo-dle production. In addition, the project program encompasses a cleanliness drive, refresher training sessions, exposure visits to Women's SHGs, and the establishment of a manufacturing unit to foster self-sufficiency.



### **Noodles & Gyathuk Making Training Programme**

Bhavishya Bharat, a non-profit organization, successfully organized a seven-day training program on Noodles and Gyathuk making for the benefit of Self-Help Groups (SHGs) in Upper Kabrey, Namthang, Sikkim. This training program, held from January 5th to January 12th, 2023, was made possible with the support of Alkem Foundation. A total of twenty-five women from the self-help group participated in this significant training initiative. Gyathuk, a variation of the renowned Thukpa noodle-based soup, holds a special place in the culinary culture of the Northeastern states of India, including Sikkim, Arunachal Pradesh, and Assam. Given the immense popularity and high demand for Noodles and Gyathuk in Sikkim, these culinary skills offer substantial potential for economic opportunities in the region.



The training program covered various activities to enhance the participants' skills and knowledge in Noodles and Gyathuk making. Through interactive sessions and practical demonstrations, the women were equipped with the necessary techniques and expertise to excel in this culinary art. The training aimed to empower the SHG members, enabling them to explore entrepreneurial ventures and contribute to their local communities. Bhavishya Bharat remains committed to organizing such impactful initiatives that promote skill development, entrepreneurship, and sustainable livelihoods among marginalized communities. The organization recognizes the importance of nurturing local traditions and culinary heritage while






### **Awareness cum Sanitation Programme and**

### **5. Oyster Mushroom Cultivation Training Programme**

Bhavishya Bharat, a non-profit organization, in collaboration with the Alkem Foundation, organized a comprehensive seven -day training program on oyster mushroom cultivation for the benefit of self-help groups (SHGs) in Upper Kabrey, Namthang, Sikkim. The training took place from March 22 to March 28, 2023.

The training program was attended by twenty-five women from the SHGs, recognizing the importance and potential of oyster mushroom cultivation in Sikkim. Oyster mushrooms are in high demand due to their nutritional value, making them a promising avenue for income generation and livelihood improvement.

Throughout the seven-day training program, a series of activities were conducted to equip the participants with the necessary knowledge and skills for successful oyster mushroom cultivation. These activities covered various aspects of cultivation techniques, including substrate preparation, spawn inoculation, proper environmental conditions, pest management, and harvesting methods.

By providing this vital training opportunity, Bhavishya Bharat, and the Alkem Foundation aim to empower women in the region, enhance their agricultural skills, and create avenues for sustainable income generation. The organizations are dedicated to promoting entrepreneurship, self-reliance, and the overall development of the local community. The successful completion of this training program marks another milestone in the ongoing efforts to uplift the lives of SHGs in Sikkim, demonstrating the commitment of Bhavishya Bharat and the Alkem Foundation to promoting sustainable agriculture and empowering women in the region.







# Livelihood Promotion of Vulnerable Communities Through Capacity Building and Startup Support

### Jeevika

Through the Jeevika initiative, Bhavishya Bharat places great emphasis on promoting sustainable livelihoods to enable communities in remote areas of the intervention States to enhance their income and raise their living standards. Within this framework, the National Bank of Agriculture and Rural Development collaborates closely with Bhavishya Bharat in Sikkim, while the SBI Foundation extends substantial financial and supportive aid in Telangana. Through the Livelihood and Entrepreneur Development Programme, Micro Enterprise Development Programme, Farmers Producer Organization, and Tribal Development Fund, we successfully empower residents of the local people, farmers, and self-help group members by providing diverse capacity-building training and startup assistance. The Jeevika program receives significant backing predominantly from NABARD in Sikkim and SBIF in Telangana, resulting in a substantial positive impact on the livelihoods of a significant population.





### Swashakti Samridhi

The Swashakti Samridhi initiative was developed to address significant social challenges comprehensively through a sustained engagement with the community. It encompasses various crucial aspects of life such as fostering livelihoods, developing infrastructure, improving healthcare and education, enhancing capacity building, promoting environmental conservation, mitigating disaster risks, and other related areas. Bhavishya Bharat is currently implementing such integrated Rural Development Projects in Sikkim and in Telangana.



### An Integrated Rural Development Model in Telangana

### **SBI Gram Seva Intervention**

With the backing of the State Bank of India Foundation. On 2nd October 2020, Bhavishya Bharat launched SBI Gram Seva, by adopting five remote villages in the Manoor Mandal of the Sangareddy district in Telangana state. Bhavishya Bharat has achieved a significant milestone by establishing a benchmark for executing high-quality operational procedures in this complex and large-scale project. As part of the project, Gram Seva Kendra has been established in all the adopted villages, providing digital services conveniently at the community's doorstep.



### 1. Digitalization

Under the intervention of the Gram Sava project, Gram Sava Kendras established in the project villages to offer a range of digital services to the villagers. These services are currently accessible in Usirikapally, Islampur, Dhanwar, and Mugdumpur villages in the Manoor Mandal, Sangareddy District, Telangana State. Additionally, they can facilitate various government programs pertaining to the village. Pamphlets detailing the services have been distributed, the initiation of Birthday Registers has been undertaken to record villagers' birthdays, and LED Board installed for displaying the government schemes, services, special events and any other important events on the Village LED Board.





All 5 Gram Seva Kendras in 5 project villages are accessible to all the farmers, to use the GSK to view agricultural documentaries, videos, and presentations. The GSKs organized several community gatherings as part of their networking and meeting activities. The main goal behind these events was the continued support of the local community. Several people received services from all GSKs, such as photocopying, money transfers, cell phone top-ups. And GSKs are used to conduct agriculture training programmes along with public outreach initiatives.



### 2. Education

While the primary focus of education lies in rural areas, it is crucial to understand that education in these regions serves more than just eradicating poverty and illiteracy. It holds significance for a variety of other aspects, including social, economic, cultural, political, and religious factors. The purpose of education interventions is to ensure quality education reaches remote villages. In today's rapidly evolving society, education plays a vital role in enabling the current generation to keep pace with these changes. As technology continues to advance, education is becoming increasingly accessible through various means. Unfortunately, rural areas often face limitations in accessing these educational resources. Under the Gram Sava project, we prioritize the establishment of computer labs and smart classrooms, along with the organization of inter-school events and remedial classes. Bhavishya Bharat emphasizes providing remedial classes to children in project villages. A total of 149 students attended Remedial Classes across all project villages. Our objective is to offer basic computer education to rural students through our Remedial classes, Digital Education. Through this initiative, we made available and accessible Smart Classrooms, and Science Lab for the rural students, where the teachers conduct computer, English and Science classes. Furthermore, we arrange diverse awareness seminars and events for the children.

### 3. Health

The Sanjeevani intervention, as a part of the Gram Seva initiative, commenced on 12th July 2021 with the noble objective of offering primary healthcare services to five designated project villages. Bhavishya Bharat, driven by its commitment to excellence, ensured the provision of high-quality primary healthcare services once a month, starting from October 2022. These services included valuable consultations with skilled doctors through the Mobile Medical Unit, essential pathology examinations, and the distribution of vital medicines.



### 4. Livelihood & Skill Development

Bhavishya Bharat's livelihood program aims to enhance livelihood opportunities, especially for rural women. It involves the establishment of self-help groups (SHGs), the provision of trade-specific training tailored to the needs and cultural context of the region, and comprehensive support to boost their confidence. The capacity building of rural women SHGs not only empowers the individuals themselves but also uplifts the entire community, contributing to an overall improvement in their lives. To support those reliant on farming, high-quality saplings have been provided to promote resilient agriculture. Additionally, the distribution of livestock and the organization of regular health camps for cattle in remote villages aid the community in reducing their living expenses.



Under the Livelihood and Skill Development interventions of the Gram Sava Project, we have conducted the following activities as mentioned below.









### **Case Study**

Begari Sujatha resides in the quaint village of Islampur, situated in the Manoor Block of the Sangareddy district. Her family comprises her husband and three daughters, forming a unit of five members. Sujatha used to run a small grocery and general shop, but financial constraints forced her to close it down a few years ago. However, thanks to the support extended by SBI Foundation and Bhavishya Bharat, she can acquire a flour mill machine as part of a social entrepreneurship intervention. Reflecting on the past, Sujatha shares, "Previously, our village lacked a flour mill. As a result, the villagers, including myself, had to travel a minimum of four kilometers to Raipally whenever we needed to use a flour mill. Now, the villagers are delighted because they no longer must travel for this service. They can conveniently access the flour mill within our locality." After obtaining the flour mill, Sujatha's family generated an additional income of Rs 1,000 to 2,000, which enabled her to reopen her old shop. This development has brought some relief, as it gradually stabilizes her family's economic situation. Beyond the assistance provided to individuals in fostering rural enterprises, the efforts of SBI Foundation and Bhavishya Bharat have played. An important role that is likely to improve the standard of living for these individuals soon.





### 5. Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH)

The WASH interventions underscore the crucial role of water in human existence. The availability of safe, affordable, and dependable drinking water and sanitation services is considered a fundamental human right. In line with this, Bhavishya Bharat has successfully implemented RO water plants in all the project villages. Consequently, every village now has access to clean drinking water within their own community. This initiative is a significant step towards fostering a peaceful and prosperous society, as well as ensuring inclusive participation in the journey towards sustainable development.








### **Activities Conducted**

- a. Operationalization of 5 Water ATMs in 5 project villages.
- b. Implementation of water filter cleanings, adhering to standard protocols and maintenance guidelines, supervised by trained personnel.
- c. Completion of the construction of community toilets in Dhanwar and Usirikapally villages.
- d. 1 Fogging machine and 15 dustbins made available for the project village.
- e. The project team actively encouraged the villagers to make use of the available dustbins in their respective villages. Furthermore, multiple workers were assigned to regularly collect and clean the dustbins, ensuring proper waste management.

These activities demonstrate the commitment of the project team to providing accessible clean water, maintaining hygiene standards, and fostering a clean environment for the benefit of the communities involved.

### 6. Strengthening of SHGs and Advocacy

As a part of women empowerment initiatives, a self-help group (SHG) activity focusing on the production of paper plate machines was established. The installation process for these machines has been successfully completed, marking a significant milestone. Currently, training sessions are being conducted to equip the women with the necessary skills and knowledge on how to operate these machines effectively. By providing this training, the aim is to empower women with the means to generate income and foster entrepreneurship within the community. This initiative stands as a testament to the commitment to women's empowerment and the promotion of sustainable livelihood opportunities.









### **Course Learnings**

During the course, participants gained knowledge and skills in the following areas:

- a. Tools and Equipment Required for Tailoring: Participants were introduced to various tools and equipment essential for tailoring, such as sewing machines, measuring tapes, scissors, and needles. They learned about their uses and how to handle them safely.
- b. Types of Fabric: Participants learned about different types of fabrics commonly used in tailoring, including cotton, silk, linen, and synthetic materials. They were taught about the characteristics of each fabric and how to select the appropriate fabric for specific projects.
- c. Taking Measurements: The course covered the important skill of taking accurate body measurements for tailoring garments. Participants learned different measurement techniques and the significance of precise measurements in achieving a well-fitting garment.
- d. The Sewing Process: Participants were guided through the step-by-step sewing process, starting from pattern cutting to stitching and finishing techniques. They learned how to operate a sewing machine, sew different types of seams, attach buttons and zippers, and create hems.
- e. Paper Craft Cutting: The course also included instruction on paper craft cutting techniques. Participants learned how to create patterns and templates on paper, which serve as guides for cutting fabric accurately and efficiently.

These skills provided participants with a solid foundation in tailoring, equipping them with essential skills and knowledge to pursue their interests and potentially explore opportunities in the field of garment making.

### 7. International Women's Day

On 8th March, the project team celebrated International Women's Day by honoring the achievements of the trainees at the Prerana Centre. As a recognition of their dedication and hard work, certificates were distributed to the qualified trainees. This gesture not only acknowledged their accomplishments but also served as a symbol of empowerment and encouragement for the women involved in the program. By commemorating International Women's Day in this manner, the project team highlighted the importance of gender equality and the significance of supporting women's advancement and skill development in the community.



### 8. Fitness and Leadership Building

As part of this intervention, we have successfully organized a range of activities focused on leadership development and youth fitness. Our primary goal is to promote good health and gender equality, aligning with the sustainable development agenda. These activities include the observance of important days such as World Breastfeeding Week, and International Yoga Day. As a token of appreciation, participants and contributing members received T-Shirts branded with the SBI logo, symbolizing their involvement in the successful execution of the event.

Furthermore, on Mahatma Gandhi Jayanthi, Bhavishya Bharat organized a 3K Run Marathon for the youth, aiming to raise awareness about safe drinking water and road safety. This initiative exemplifies our commitment to community engagement and the promotion of important social causes. Additionally, the community gyms in the villages have been actively utilized by children and young people, encouraging physical activity and sports as integral components of maintaining good health and overall well-being. To further empower the youth, we are focusing on strengthening youth entrepreneurial skills. Assist them by providing the necessary equipment to generate income and economic stability. Moreover, the establishment of an obstacle ground at the Youth Training Centre serves as an excellent initiative to promote and support aspiring candidates interested in joining the army, paramilitary, police etc. Through these diverse activities, we aim to foster leadership qualities, improve fitness levels, and provide opportunities for economic growth and personal development among the youth in the community.









### 9. Networking Meeting and Awareness

The team at Bhavishya Bharat is actively engaged in conducting regular meetings of the Gram Seva Committee. These meetings serve as platforms for discussing the current availability of services and identifying the needs within the project area. Through collaborative decision-making, the committee works towards optimizing



resource utilization in an efficient manner. Additionally, efforts are made to raise awareness among the community about State and Central Government schemes, ensuring that eligible individuals are informed and can benefit from these programs. We actively supported beneficiaries in availing various programs and projects by facilitating the necessary services. This included visiting banks to help open Savings Bank Accounts, linking Aadhaar with mobile numbers, Modifications in Aadhaar cards, and ensuring enrollment in Kisan Samman Nidhi etc., Through these interventions and collaborative efforts, Bhavishya Bharat continues to make significant strides in improving the overall well-being and livelihoods of the community it serves.





### **10.** Infrastructure Development

Since the inception of the project, several inputs have been provided to the project villages, aimed at enhancing their infrastructure and amenities.

Notable contributions include the procurement and installation of cement benches throughout the cluster. Digital boards have been installed in all the villages, serving as effective communication platforms for sharing important information with the community. Furthermore, village boards, troughs, and Travis have been installed in each village, accompanied by branding works that help in identifying and promoting these facilities. Another significant accomplishment is the completion of electrification works in all the villages, adhering to the planned timeline and budget. This achievement ensures access to reliable electricity, improving the quality of life for the villagers and supporting the overall development of the community. These efforts demonstrate the commitment of the project team towards providing necessary infrastructure and amenities, ultimately contributing to the well-being and progress of the project villages.





















We have noted that out of the 15 solar lights installed, 10 are functional, and discussions were held with the vendor regarding the replacement of solar light-drivers. The installation process for the replacements is currently underway.

### 11. Environment

We are actively involved in environmental conservation initiatives. And taking various steps to protect and nurture the environment, such as creating groundwater recharge pits, raising awareness about plantations, and organizing events on World Environment Day. Additionally, small-scale initiatives, including remedial classes, have been implemented to educate the children in the villages about environmental conservation. A significant afforestation activity took place at Usirikapally village, where a vast man-made forest called SBI JAN VAN was established. This initiative aims to foster a thriving ecosystem and enhance the green cover in the area. It is anticipated that the community will actively participate in the care and maintenance of the plants, and in due time, they will reap the benefits as the plants mature.

These endeavors highlight the project team's commitment to environmental stewardship, promoting sustainability, and creating a greener and healthier environment for the benefit of the community and future generations.

As part of the reforestation intervention, daily watering activities are being carried out by the multi workers of the Gram Panchayat. Additionally, as a crucial component of the environmental initiative, Check dams have been constructed in Dhanwar and Mugdumpur for water storage. These dams serve as water conservation structures, contributing to sustainable water management in the area. The







construction of the Dhanwar Check Dam has been successfully completed, and it was officially handed over to the community on World Water Day. This significant milestone signifies the importance of water conservation and highlights the project team's dedication to promoting sustainable practices. Furthermore, the Mugdumpur Check Dam has been completed and is now prepared for handover to the community. This upcoming handover demonstrates the project's continuous efforts to enhance water resources and support environmental preservation. Through these interventions, the project team is actively engaged in protecting the environment, conserving water, and fostering community involvement in sustainable practices. These initiatives contribute to the overall well-being of the project area and underscore the significance of environmental stewardship in creating a better future.





### 12. Other Activities

**A. Youth Training Center:** The training will focus on building skills in a range of areas such as physical fitness, self-defense, and communication. The training program will be designed to be engaging, interactive, and supportive, with a focus on empowering candidates to succeed.



**B.** One Fist Rice: To foster moral values and cultivate a sense of generosity in children, they are provided with the opportunity to donate a fistful of rice. These young children enthusiastically participate in this initiative, collectively gathering an impressive monthly donation of 40 to 50 kilograms of rice. This contribution serves a vital role in providing nourishment to approximately 50 orphans, ensuring they have access to nutritious meals. By involving children in acts of giving, we promote empathy, compassion, and a sense of social responsibility from an early age.
